GOSPEL REFLECTION: THE GIFT OF FAITH

"Much will be required of the person entrusted with much. (Luke 12:48)

What if someone entrusted you with a million dollars and told you to use it to open a food bank? Would you keep it for yourself and use it to buy a fancy car or to travel to an exotic place? No, you would get to work figuring out how to use the money wisely so that you could feed the poor and hungry.

Now, it's unlikely that someone would hand you a million dollars, but God has entrusted you with something infinitely more valuable. It's the gift of faith! And he doesn't want you to keep it all for yourself. As Jesus said in today's Gospel, "*Much will be required of the person entrusted with much*" (Luke 12:48). So what are you going to do with this precious gift? Let's take a look at this reading for some ideas.

First, we need to put our faith into action. In Jesus' parable of the good steward, the vigilant servants await their master's return and are ready to open the door "immediately" when he arrives (Luke 12:36). Jesus wants us to be prepared for his Second Coming. But he also wants us to be vigilant as we await his coming into our hearts in this life. We need to stay faithful to prayer, always listening for his voice and ready to do what he is asking of us.

Second, we need to be ready to share our gift of faith. We know that God wants us to help people come to know how much he loves them. Yet as we go about our daily lives, it's easy to get sidetracked and distracted by the things of this world. Then, like those servants in the parable, we risk missing opportunities to share our faith when they arise.

Yes, much has been entrusted with us—more than we can ever imagine. Today and every day, let's ask for the grace to also do what is required of us. May we always be like those vigilant servants who faithfully await their master's return!

"Lord, thank you for entrusting me with the gift of faith."
